Music Group Information

Making music together is one of the most powerful things a young musician can do to develop both their love of music and their all-round musicianship. It really helps to accelerate progress. In Sheffield there are lots of options. You can join a music group, you can join a choir, or you can join both if you want to make super-fast progression!

As a result of growing financial pressures, we have made the necessary decision to revise our subscription structure. Moving forward, a fixed fee will apply for attendance to one group. For those wishing to participate in additional groups, a modest supplementary charge will now be introduced. We have considered our prices against other alternative after school activities and whilst we understand this may be disappointing have not taken this decision lightly. We have over 30 music groups and choirs that rehearse weekly (term time only) from beginner to advanced level, so we are sure there is a group for your child to join and enjoy. No experience is needed for our Choirs, Samba and Learn to Play Guitar/Recorder so if you have other children who would like to attend but don't play an instrument yet they can join in the fun too!

We offer free places for children who meet our bursary criteria and even if you don't qualify for a free place, we have a subsidised rate for those who require financial support.

^{*}In some cases, we may be able to offer a 20-minute weekly shared lesson between 2 young people. This is only available where our music leader believes that there are 2 young musicians at the same age, instrument and musical ability. The music leader will only be able to make this decision when lessons commence.

Billing dates and payment deadlines

Autumn Term invoices (September - December Lessons)

Invoices to be sent around the 25th of June with a deadline of the 9th of July

Spring Term invoices (January-April lessons)

Invoices to be sent around the 19^{th} of November with a deadline of 3^{rd} of December

Summer Term invoices (April - July lessons)

Invoices to be sent around $\mathbf{25}^{th}$ of February with a deadline of the $\mathbf{11}^{th}$ of March

No. of lessons expected if starting lessons in September:

Fortnightly lessons - 17 lessons over the academic year. You will be billed for 6 in Autumn and 5 in Spring and 6 in Summer.

Weekly lessons - 34 lessons over the academic year. You will be billed for 12 in Autumn and 11 in Spring and Summer.

Out of School Lessons – We will be offering 33 lessons over the academic year in line with the Music Group delivery.
